Agent proceeded to this address and was informed by Mrs. Mebowd that Mr. Web did not inform her as to where he would spend his vacation, but she expected him to return in a few days and would advise Agent by telephone upon his return. On this date Agent called at the SANFORD PRODUCTION COMPANY, 1442 Beachwood Drive, Hollywood, California, and interviewed FRANK M. SANFORD. President of the Company, with reference to subjects OSBORN, SYAN and MADSON,

Er. Sanford stated he was not acquainted with MADSON or RYAN, but knew OSPORN slightly as the latter had been employed by his company temporarily at various times. Mr. Sanford seemed very indignant over the fact that FRANK S. MATTISON, a young man employed as salesman on the road for him and who had acted as director for him in the past, was being stopped in various cities in the Middle-West by government officers who suspected him of being R. G. MADSON. Mr. Sanford said Osborn's former associates about the studio were shocked to hear the news of his arrest as a blackmeiler at Springfield. Ohio, as published in the Los Angeles papers.

EXCHARD CLAPHAN and LEO MOLONEY, who lived directly across the street from OSBORN's residence at 2575 Beachwood Drive, stated they had met Osborn in the pictures and became friendly with him, attending a number of parties at his home, and that they had had a great deal of respect for him and has niece. ROSE PUTNAM, who resided with him as his hensekseper. They stated they were surprised to hear of his trouble and CLAPHAN stated to Agent. "You can imagine the position deform has put us in. in the community and with the neighbors, as bein essociates. of his and Rose Futnam. In. Followy and his wife, an well as the states

and myself have been placed in most embarrassing circumstances, and if you can convey word to Don Osborn, you might tell him that it will not be well for him or Rose Putnam to show their faces in this neighborhood or in Los Angeles Again."

August 2, 1923. Agent with Detective Trainor, called at 1731 South Normandie Frenue, Los An eles, and found that GEORGE F. WEH had returned from his vacation. He was taken to the Bureau office and questioned by Agent, who ras of the opinion that he would throw a good desi of light on this case. However, Mr. Web advised Agent thet he had been running around with Hadson's wife for sometime unknown to Madson and that he wat never closely associated with Esdson and was unsware what his business. He told Agent to consult Police Records at San Diego, California, Was. as information could be secured thre regarding MAY RYAN. supposed wife of Ladson.

Agent questioned Lr. Wet in regard to the letter mailed to J. R. BUSHEBLL, from Los Angeles on December 20, 1922, signed BARL FRANK DUSTIN, General Delivery, Los Angeles. Web denied that he ever wrote any such letter or that he was aware of the fact that Osborn and Rose Putcam were blackmailers.

A samile of web's handwriting is being attached to copy of this report to the Cincinnati office, and it is requested that Woh's writing be compared with the signature of Barl Frank Dustin.

Ageny me had a cover placed on the mail of BAFL FRAME DUSTIN at General Delivery, but up to this date no such person has called for mail. There is a question in Agent's mind as to whether or not WHH is

persons to live in.

Agents interviewed Maghelle Anderson, former wife of DOM OSBORN, and in addition to the information as given in previous interview by this party by Agent Meehan, she advised that a girl by the name of Billen had been living with Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Clapham across the street from DOM OSBORN and ROSE PUTNAM, and that this girl, who is now playing in a review at the Newhouse Hotel, Salt Lake City, had made admissions to a friend of here, one Helen Page, also with this same review, to the effect that ROSE PUTNAM has confided all of her relations with DOM OSBORN to Mrs. Clapham, also the transactions as to the second trip to Springfield, Ohio, etc. Mrs. Maybelle Osborn, or inderson, also advised that she had received information that ROSE PUTNAM shortly before making a trip to Springfiled, in July, 1923, hed undergone an operation for an abortion, at 2575 Beechwood Drive, and that Wrs. Leo Maloney had nursed her at this time.

Agents interviewed Leonard Clapham and wife, 2567 Beechwood Drive, but these parties absolutely denied that ROSE made a confident of Mrs. Clapham, although they did know that she and DOS OSBORS were to make a trip East for some purpose. These parties deny that they even knew that ROSE had been sick, although they evidently were frequent visitors at the place there. Handwriting of these two parties indicate they are not the parties who wrote the letters under the name of Sarl Frank Dustin. These parties recognize the place. Mrs. Clapham advises that party at Salt Lake City is Killen Dunkle, and on October 26th, the following wire was sent to Agent Kimball, Salt Lake City;

Agents interviewed Leo Maloney and wife, 2305 Beechwood Drive, who advised they knew both DON and ROSE and visited at their place and have also had them at their home here. Mr. Maloney advises that he has known OSBORN for about nine years all together, and ROSE for the last year. He denies that he knew there were any relations existing between these two parties. He advises that he often attended parties at their place, at which they had considerable to drink. He could not advise of any place where OSBCRN had worked except in the produstion of the picture in which Matty Mattison appeared. He advises that he met BLACKY MADSON once at 2578 Beechwood Drive, and at this time hebrother of ROSE PUTHAM was also present. He advises he uncarstands George Web was running around with the wife of BLACKY MADSON. Both advise that ROSE had been sick shortly before going East on this last trip and that Mrs. Maloney had visited her at the place mile same ------100 - 110 - 100

was sick, but deny that they knew what the cause of the sickness was. They advise that they understand PATRICIA PAINER was arrested in connection with a diamond robbery, together with BLACKY THOMPSON.

Agents interviewed Rerman A. Mosher, 2225 Beechwood Drive, and he advises that the equity of PATRIOIA PAIMER from 2575 Beechwood Drive was assigned to DON OSBORN on March 9, 1925. PATRIOIA FALMER's equity at that time was worth, according topayments made, \$313.20. On April 6th, OSBORN made one payment of \$550.00. All payments of OSBORN on this place, to June 22nd, totaled \$470.00.

Inquiry of the neighbors in the vicinity of 2575 Beechwood Drive developed that most of the people here are unwilling to say anything of value, with the exception of Mrs. Edward Jakeson, 6121 Gien Alder, wife of a carpenter, and evidently of a different class from the usual tenants of the property along this drive, and she advises that there were numerous all night parties at this place, and although they live immediately to the rear of this place OSBORN and ROSE FUTHAN never had much to say to them.

Continuing investigation as to developments looking to the location of R.G. MADSON and J.A. RYAN and to details involving HARBER I. ROSS, alias ALBERT 5. HARRIS. now in jail at Cincinnati. especially as to his trip to Springfield. Ohio in October in an effort to make a second shate nown of JOHN L. EUSHELL.

Through a confidential informant, Detective Reed of the Los Angeles Folice Department, had learned that ROSS, together with certain other parties here in August, were planning some sort of a shake down of a party in the East. At that time, HERBERT I, ROSS was doopprink
